K - Grade 5

Broadway Stars

Sing, act and dance in this fun musical theatre class. Cartooning

Circus Tricks

Ladies and gentlemen, in the centre ring, come and learn basic circus skills like juggling, spinning a Diablo, simple acrobatics and clowning. Combine your physical and creative energies in this fun and lively class. Teacher: James O'Shea

Clay Play

Use your imagination to create a hand-built project each day. Projects created on Monday and Tuesday will be kiln-fired, while other days will feature non-fired creations. All projects will be painted and completed by Friday. Bring a large cardboard box for taking finished work home. Teacher: Elaine Hansen

Claymation

Create your own stop-motion animations for the world to see! You'll practice clay design and sculpting, and then learn techniques of movement and timing when we film our own short films for YouTube. Teacher: Kenten Bowick

Creative Movement

Explore the freedom to express yourself through contemporary dance. Try out different styles of contemporary dance and foster creativity and improvisation. We'll work on a progressive combination throughout the week. Teacher: Philippa Myler

Dancemakers

Learn how to build your own dances using contemporary dance movements, composition and improvisational skills. Use your creativity and imagination! Teacher: Philippa Myler

Drawing and Painting Adventures

Here is your chance to explore the incredible world of art! Have fun experimenting with watercolours, tempera, pencils, pastels, chalk, pen and ink. Explore various skills like colour blending, wax resistance, printing techniques and more in a fun and creative way. Teacher: Olga Pirogova

Dynamic Drumming

Learn to play the djembe hand drum! In this hands-on music class, you'll learn the basic jamming and playing techniques for the djembe drum. Drums are provided, but you are welcome to bring your own. No musical experience necessary. Teacher: Jason Overy

Explore Painting

Learn exciting new ways to add colour to your pictures using tempera paint, watercolours, chalk pastels and more. Shake things up and use non-traditional art tools like feathers, sticks and sponges. Fibre Fun

Create your own beautiful and functional one-of-a-kind treasures. Make a new project each day by spinning & dying and weaving & felting, while gaining hands-on experience developing colour sense and an understanding of how different fibres can be transformed. Teacher: Catherine Dumaine

Come and have some fun with drama! Play drama games, tell stories, pretend to be other things and put together a complete show at the end of the week. Drama is fun! Teacher: James O'Shea

Guitar for Beginners

Learn to play the guitar. Discover the enjoyment of music and the guitar in a fun group setting. Learn basic guitar techniques like chord shapes and fingering for at least one major scale. You'll cover some basic theory and play simple chord progressions and songs of different genres. Guitars are provided. Teacher: Jimmy Baldwin

Magical Marionettes

Create your own puppet on a string. You'll make the head using papier mâché and create the body of this simple marionette using fabrics and fun foam. Teacher: TBA

Double, double toil and trouble . . . Before Harry Potter and Twilight, there was Macbeth! Jump into the bubbling cauldron and explore one of the bloodiest plays of all time by the great bard himself, Will Shakespeare. Taught by Kevin Bennett, acclaimed as one of Vancouver's hottest young directors and teachers, students will explore text, character and performance to bring to life a 60-minute adaptation of *Macbeth*.
